

NAPRA NOTES

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As the year 2017 winds down, this issue of *NAPRA Notes* highlights some of the organization's achievements, ongoing projects and forthcoming changes.

Release of Cannabis Position Statement

In anticipation of upcoming legislation to legalize cannabis as promised by the federal government, NAPRA held a discussion in March 2017 with various stakeholders to discuss the role of pharmacy practitioners and the effects on public safety.

Following these fruitful consultations, NAPRA prepared a draft cannabis position statement. On April 13, 2017, the Government of Canada proposed the *Cannabis Act* to legalize, strictly regulate and restrict access to cannabis. NAPRA's members re-

visited the position statement in the context of the proposed federal bill and released its [Cannabis Position Statement](#) in July 2017. The release stated NAPRA's position in regards to the role of pharmacy practitioners pertaining to non-medical cannabis, which is that "pharmacy practitioners must not be involved in the distribution of cannabis for non-medical purposes." The statement also indicated NAPRA's stance on other aspects related to cannabis: that non-medical cannabis distribution sites must not use misleading words such as "dispensary" or symbols generally associated with pharmacies (e.g. a green cross), that cannabis producers be required to follow good production practices and meet appropriate labelling and packaging requirements and that advertising and marketing on cannabis products should be restricted.

As this issue is increasingly of public interest, NAPRA and its members continue to monitor ongoing activities at the provincial, territorial and national levels, such as the recent release of a proposed federal regulatory framework for cannabis. Feedback will be shared with the government of Canada as part of the consultation process for the framework.

Changes to NAPRA Governance

In 2017, NAPRA continued its efforts toward a significant change in its governance. After careful consideration, the formal changes required to allow for the change in governance were approved during a special meeting of the members in November 2017. Among other changes aimed at making NAPRA more effective and responsive, a key change at its Board level is that NAPRA's Board of Directors will be comprised of the registrars of the provincial colleges, representatives from the territories and Canadian Forces, and up to three other individuals who will meet specific needs identified by NAPRA.

Margot Priddle (Newfoundland and Labrador Pharmacy Board) now serves as Chair of the Board with Nancy Lum-Wilson (Ontario College of Pharmacists) serving as Vice Chair. A complete list of the [Board members](#) can be found on our website. Full implementation of the new model will follow in 2018.

The [Pharmacists' Gateway Canada](#) initiative continues to be a success: the Gateway has received a higher than expected number of enrolments in 2017, and Client Services has responded to over 3600 inquiries. Enhancements to Pharmacists' Gateway Canada were completed and implemented in July 2017. The user experience has been improved, the platform has been updated and the system's security has been strengthened to be in line with current industry standards. It is expected that Gateway operations will continue to be busy in 2018.

.pharmacy Program


The .pharmacy initiative aims to identify safe and legitimate online pharmacies. The program is run by a key partner of NAPRA, the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy in the U.S., in collaboration with various stakeholders around the world.



The majority of online pharmacies operating in Canada sell drugs from foreign locations. When drugs are purchased from countries that do not have strict regulations in place, they can cause serious health risks to the unsuspecting public. The .pharmacy initiative aims to reduce these risks by identifying legitimate sites that sell approved medications from identifiable sources. To date, six Canadian pharmacies have applied for and received a .pharmacy URL. As awareness of the program increases, we anticipate more Canadian online pharmacy businesses will see the value of the .pharmacy domain name. NAPRA continues to support and to promote the operation of this initiative in Canada. National Pharmacy Technician Bridging Education Program

At the beginning of the year, the number of licensed pharmacy technicians across Canada was 7,339. The Bridging Program continues to be offered in select jurisdictions only. For more information including course registration deadlines, please visit the [NAPRA website](#).



What is the Bridging Program? The National Pharmacy Technician Bridging Education Program enables individuals who worked as pharmacy technicians before regulation was introduced, to upgrade their skills to align with changes in the scope of practice of pharmacy technicians without having to return to school to complete a full-time training program.
